Decisions to be taken:-

How many plug plants of each species do we purchase?

Odd numbers of plants planted in groups appear more natural than even numbers.

Do we purchase Large Stock Plants rather than Standard Stock Plants?

This depends on whether NPK says that Large Stock Plants planted in autumn 2008 are more likely to flower in 2009 than the standard plug plants.

Also if they are likely to establish and flourish more quickly than standard plug plants.

We need to assess the balance between germinating seed by volunteers and the use of commercially purchased plug plants.
